October brings us further into Fall and the Holiday season. It also brings us (mostly Dave) help with all the duties that keeps the Knickerbocker up and running. Our newest member of the Management Team is Joe Poldruhi. Joe is a true professional and comes in with 23 years experience in construction and maintenance of multiunit housing. He has won several awards for Best Property as well as "Maintenance Technician of the Year". He is well versed in the countless situations that occur in all aspects of apartment living.

We also want to thank both Dave and Joe for their above and beyond diligence in tracking down parts and plumbers for our boiler situation over Labor Day weekend. As I am sure all of you are aware, there are some situations that occur in a building of this size that are unforeseen and cannot be anticipated.

A few 'housekeeping' reminders:

Please do not go directly to Dave or Joe, don't knock on their doors or approach them in the building requesting work be done in your unit. Please make sure you make a work order through the office. We are required to document all work done in our units for maintenance records and reporting to federal and state agencies.

On October 5, 2022, there will be a mandatory Federal/State inspection of our building. The inspectors will choose 23 units (we will not know which units until the day of the inspection) that will be inspected. Please make sure your breaker box is not covered and there is nothing blocking your window. Thank you for your co-operation.

It's never a good idea to pour grease down kitchen or bathroom drains. It causes expensive plumbing situations. Try waiting for the grease to solidify, wipe out the pan with a paper towel and throw away or use an old soup can. Just please no grease down the drain.

Also as of October 1, 2022, any after hours (Monday – Friday after 4, Saturday, Sunday or Holidays) 'lock outs' will be charged \$10.

Your emergency pendent is ONLY to be used for medical emergencies. If you need Emergency Services and cannot call 911 yourself — use the medical pendent provided by the Knickerbocker. This pendent is provided for medical

emergencies ONLY. A clogged toilet is not considered a medical emergency.

As of October 1, 2022, there will be a charge of \$.50 for black and white and \$1.00 for color copies in the office.

Please make sure your visitors (family, friends, medical aides, etc.) are aware of the residents only in the parking lots. This means after 4:00 pm on weekdays, Saturday, Sunday and holidays as well. We have contacted a tow service which will tow vehicles at the owner's expense. Also, no parking in front of the dumpsters, ever! I will personally be checking the parking lots after 4:00 pm and on weekends and holidays.

Thank you for using garbage cans for cigarette butts and doggie poop bags. The grounds are looking better and better. Remember, all dogs need to be on a leash **anytime** they are not in your unit!

Shopping carts are a courtesy provided by the Knickerbocker. It they are left anywhere other than outside the back (north door) hanging up, where you found them, they will be confiscated and not available for your use. So please, if you use a shopping cart, put it back where you found it. Thanks.




